<p>Proposed Location(s): Giant Dwarf Theatre, Chippendale Sydney</p>	
<p>Objective:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> To generate an open discussion of racism in Australia through the personal reflections of both emerging and established Indigenous and culturally diverse artists

Its edgy format is an opportunity for artists/comedians to draw on personal experience to blend humor with more painful insights, and is a platform for a diversity of views to be expressed around the theme of racism

<p>Proposed Location(s): TBC – RecNSW has 23 member LRGs across NSW</p>	
<p>Objective: Supporting Local Reconciliation Groups to deliver place-based NRW events</p>	
<p>Expected Outcome: Supporting and strengthening reconciliation and community partnerships, raising community awareness, capacity building and outreach for LRGs, inspiring people to participate in these events and contribute to reconciliation activities and processes more broadly in their communities.</p>	<p>BUDGET: \$3000</p>
<p>How does this activity speak to the 2019 focus dimension of <i>Race Relations</i>? Many of Reconciliation NSW member LRGs are very active in promoting strong relationships between Indigenous and non-Indigenous people as celebrating and acknowledging Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures and histories and furthering participation in reconciliation activities within local communities.</p>	

<p>Proposed Activity: Screening the Namatjira Project documentary</p>	<p>Reach: 50-70 broad community audience</p>
<p>Proposed Location(s): Golden Age Cinema Surry Hills</p>	
<p>Objective: Increased understanding of historical injustices experienced by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and the ongoing need to support future generations to thrive</p>	
<p>Expected Outcome: “... Getting this documentary out for the world to see will help us continue the work passed down to us by Albert. Help us to keep our culture strong, to teach the young ones and to celebrate our remarkable heritage into the future.” – The Namatjira Family</p>	<p>BUDGET: \$500</p>
<p>How does this activity speak to the 2019 focus dimension of <i>Race Relations</i>? The Namatjira Project documentary is part of a campaign to restore justice to the Namatjira family</p>	

<p>Proposed Activity: Simultaneous online NRW-themed activities delivered directly to NSW classrooms via the Wingaru platform. These will be available free to schools and early childhood centres</p>	<p>Reach: Available to all NSW school students</p>
<p>Proposed Location(s): NSW-wide</p>	
<p>Objective: To provide activities that are a mechanism for teachers to easily and directly engage with the NRW 2019 theme during NRW. Inspire teachers and students to engage with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander knowledge and experience as well as get involved in the concept of reconciliation and this year’s NRW and SRC themes.</p>	
<p>Expected Outcome: Increased teacher confidence to teach and engage with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander perspectives in the classroom.</p>	<p>BUDGET: \$1500</p>
<p>How does this activity speak to the 2019 focus dimension of <i>Race Relations</i>? Activities will be developed around the NRW 2019 race relations theme. Separate activities for: Early childhood; Stage K and 1; Stage 2 and 3; Stage 4 and 5.</p>
