

Supporting the Uluru Statement from the Heart in your Workplace

This year has brought hope for a better, fairer and more equitable future as we have witnessed a change of government and a commitment to the [Uluru Statement from the Heart](#) in full - **Voice, Treaty, Truth**. It is now more important than ever to keep the momentum of change alive as we look to our First Nations Peoples to guide us toward a referendum.

Here are some tips for how your workplace can support the Uluru Statement:

1. The first step is to know your material, ensure all your staff know what the [Uluru Statement](#) is and why it is important. When a referendum is called everybody needs to know what they are voting for. The Statement is also available in a diverse group of languages - to have it translated visit the [Uluru Statement website](#).
2. Share the information with your professional network, send out links to [further reading](#) and have something in your signature block that pays respect to and acknowledges the traditional custodians of the land you work on.
3. Endorse the Statement, this can be as simple as putting up [posters](#) around your workplace and adding your logo to them. You can openly support the Uluru Statement publicly through your social media and communications.

All Australians must listen to the continuing voices of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples who have laid out a clear and practical path forward. At the heart of reconciliation is self-determination and we must support the constitutional recognition of a First Nations voice to parliament, that will allow First Nations Peoples and communities to make decisions about the issues that affect them. With First Nations Peoples making up only 3% of the population, it is up to the rest of Australia to educate themselves and those around them and be ready to vote yes when a referendum is called.
