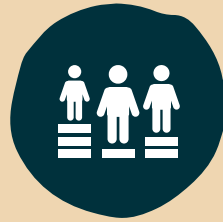

Widespread acceptance of our nation's history & agreement that the wrongs of the past will never be repeated.



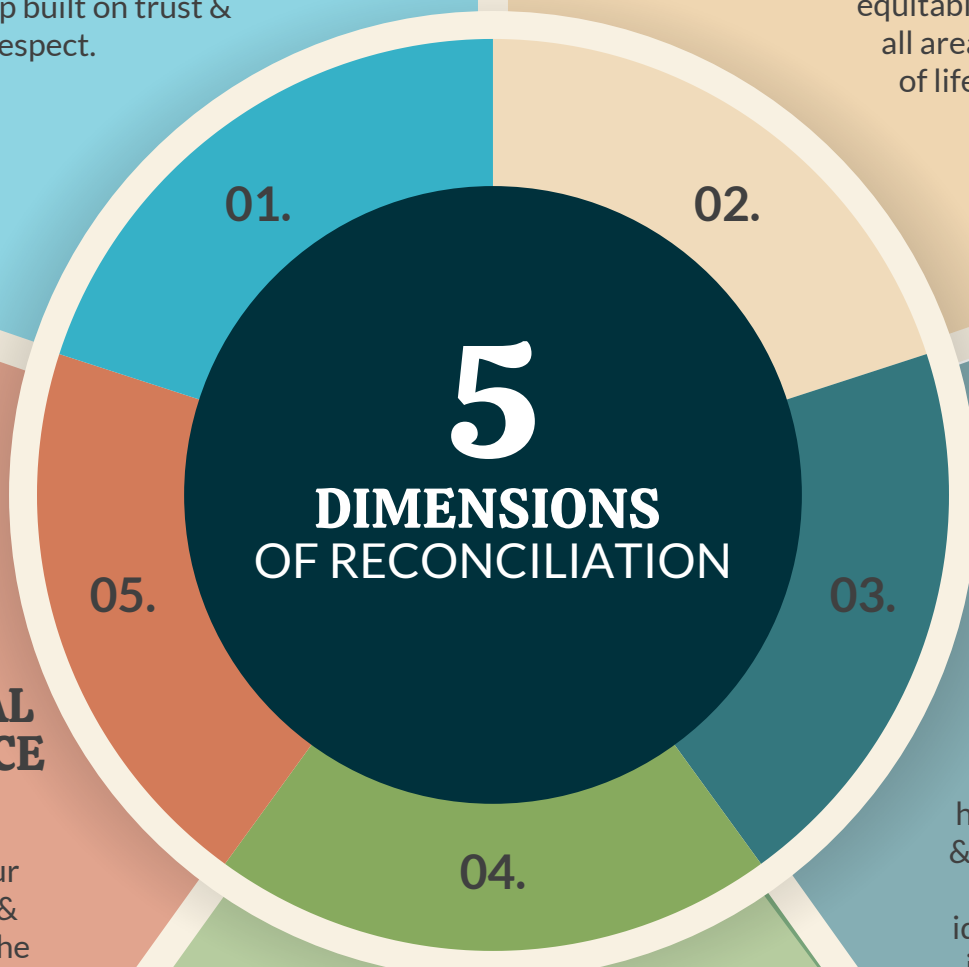
## UNITY

# Our Commitment to the 5 Dimensions of Reconciliation

## Race Relations



Reconciliation NSW strives towards a more just and equitable society through the elimination of racism. We run campaigns, programs, and events to educate and engage communities, organisations, and schools in anti-racism practices. Real change starts with conversation. To fight racism, we need to talk about it- openly and honestly.

## Equity & Equality



At Reconciliation NSW, we support self-determination by amplifying First Nations voices. Our platforms share First Nations events, initiatives, and products, while encouraging non-Indigenous people to learn more about First Nations histories and cultures through meaningful engagement.

## Unity



Through education across schools, organisations, and the wider community, Reconciliation NSW supports the embedding of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander perspectives. Our Pathways to Reconciliation program partners with local Elders and cultural educators to teach schools about First Nations cultures. Beyond the classroom, our website provides a range of toolkits and factsheets to educate non-Indigenous Australians on our shared histories.

## Institutional Integrity



Reconciliation NSW works with organisational members across the five dimensions of reconciliation. Through tailored membership, businesses are supported to approach reconciliation with transparency and integrity. We also partner with NSW Parliament and local governments to strengthen institutional support for reconciliation and ensure its core values are understood by leaders.

## Historical Acceptance



Without acknowledgement and acceptance of the past, Australia cannot move forward as a unified nation. Reconciliation NSW centres the voices of First Nations peoples to address the ongoing impacts of historical injustices, and helps non-Indigenous Australians understand the social, political, and economic frameworks of the country. Through our programs and events, we work towards a statewide understanding of the importance of reconciliation through self-determination.
